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Removing the Mystic and Religious from Miracles

MIRACLES HAPPEN WHEN WE HARMONIZE WITH GOD'S LAWS

- The Logos in Creator implies that he created all things logically
 - GOD IS A GOD OF ORDER NOT CHAOS (confusion = disorder) (1Cor.14:33)
 - These laws operate whether we know them or not
 - Rom.1:20 – Knowing God's attributes and laws by looking at the order in nature
- We can all be miracle workers
 - Christians should be expert miracle workers
 - A TV is a miracle for a primitive man, but it is natural to an electric engineer
- Heb.11:3 – By operating in faith we understand how everything must first be seen in faith (not visible physically)
 - We “need” to believe that all things are possible
 - Before creating or doing anything we must have the idea, see it then we can implement it – Inventor, Architect
 - You have created your past
 - You create your future, don't let your past determine your future
- You don't need to be a Christian to experience a miracle
 - Jesus, Paul and others healed everybody (Daughter of Syro-Phoenician woman Mt.15:21-28, Servant of Centurion Mt.8:5)
 - Jesus always said according to your faith even for non-Jews
 - Jesus did not heal any born again believer
 - God's law of faith is put in operation, not the devil
 - Why be a Christian then?
- Should have better understanding from the Word and the Holy Spirit, and better, regular results
- A relationship with God makes a difference

Religious thinking opposes the idea of Miracles determined by laws

Religious people think that that it would decrease the desire to know God

- The truth is just the opposite
 - Ministers say, accept Jesus and then get your healing
 - The Bible shows a different pattern
 - Be healed, then accept Jesus
- The basic question is: If God is love, why do some receive a miracle while others do not?
 - This makes God unpredictable, not faithful
 - The idea that we need to go to God to convince Him to give us our miracle contradicts His goodness and faithfulness
- The Bible says that God is faithful, not a respecter of persons (discriminates) – Rom.2:11
 - The Bible says that the finished work of the cross has provided all we need for life and godliness - 2Pet.1:3
- God cannot break His own laws
 - God does not change, He is consistent – Jam.1:17, Heb.13:8, Ec.3:14, Ps.119:89-91
- Mal.3:8 – I change not, therefore you sons of Jacob are not destroyed

Seeing the Goodness of God – Rom.2:4

- He loves us and created a world operating by fixed, dependable laws
- He has given to every generation the ability to understand the laws we need to know
 - If we are open –
 - Now it is even better
- We are the only species that can chose to change our destiny
 - By making decisions according to his laws
- Because the heart of man is callous (Mt.13:15), He sent Jesus to
 - pay for our sins
 - create in us a new heart made of flesh, not stone or hard

- remove the veil between us and God
 - show us how to operate in this world
- He sent the Holy Spirit to dwell in us, guide us, and teach us (Jn.14:26, Jn.16:13)
- Those who understand God and His laws appreciate and love God deeply
